- * Citizens (people) have the POWER to GOVERN
- * Citizens *DELEGATE = entrust, their power to leaders they elect to represent them AND serve them!
- * Citizens and their representatives work
 <u>together</u> to promote the
 <u>"common good</u> rather than their own interests

*common good aka *common welfare means the good which is for community as a whole- what's best for EVERYONE!

Why did the Founders LOVE the idea of a REPUBLICAN GOVERNMENT <3(WTP pg 23)

The founders saw some of the benefits of a Republican Government

as...

Representatives are *elected* to serve the *common good*

Representatives stand for the beliefs of the people, **DO WHAT IS BEST** for the **PEOPLE**

Having *representatives* make the *law* is more efficent Having reps make laws is faster and better than trying to get EVERYONE to agree → but since they REPRESENT the PEOPLE we're good ex) ice cream for class

The **PEOPLE** have a say in **THEIR government**

The people *ELECT* who they want to represent them- the people control the gov. FTP,BTP VOTE= VOICE=CHANGE!!!

The *representatives* are *responsible* to the *people!*

<u>ACCOUNTABILITY</u>, they MUST serve the people, MUST serve common good- its their JOB!!!

What were the disadvantages of a REPUBLICAN GOVERNMENT?

- People in the <u>republic</u> have to be
 VERY <u>SIMILAR</u> they cannot be
 <u>different</u> → the colonies were
 extremely <u>diverse</u> (remember melting pot!)
- People in a diverse group break into
 factions = interest groups. These
 factions could work against the *common good* →Since the colonies were *diverse* we were

- to make and administer <u>laws</u> for their government and country. *Accountability






